



- Our team conducted a nationwide survey of Recovery Community Centers in 2021.
 - Results presented in our <u>Sept. 2022</u> and <u>Oct. 2022</u> seminars.



Recovery Data Platform – Background

History

- RDP was developed to meet the unique needs of RCOs and other recovery support providers
- Designed to enhance therapeutic alliance
- Aggregation/segregation of data on recovery outcomes
- 2.0 version was developed and launched with feedback from existing customers




