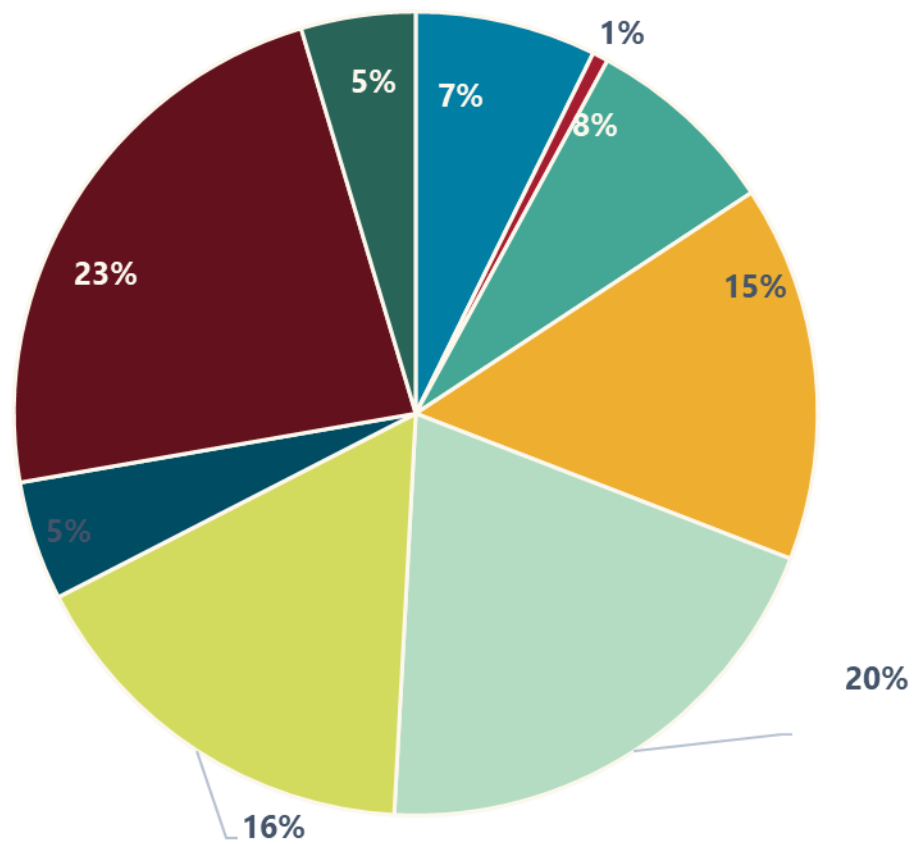

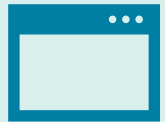

Setting the Stage



- Our team conducted a nationwide survey of Recovery Community Centers in 2021.
 - Results presented in our [Sept. 2022](#) and [Oct. 2022](#) seminars.
- In this survey we asked, “Does your RCC currently have a standardized way to assess if/how clients/participants progress in their recovery or benefit from the services of your center/organization?”
 - 69% said “Yes.”

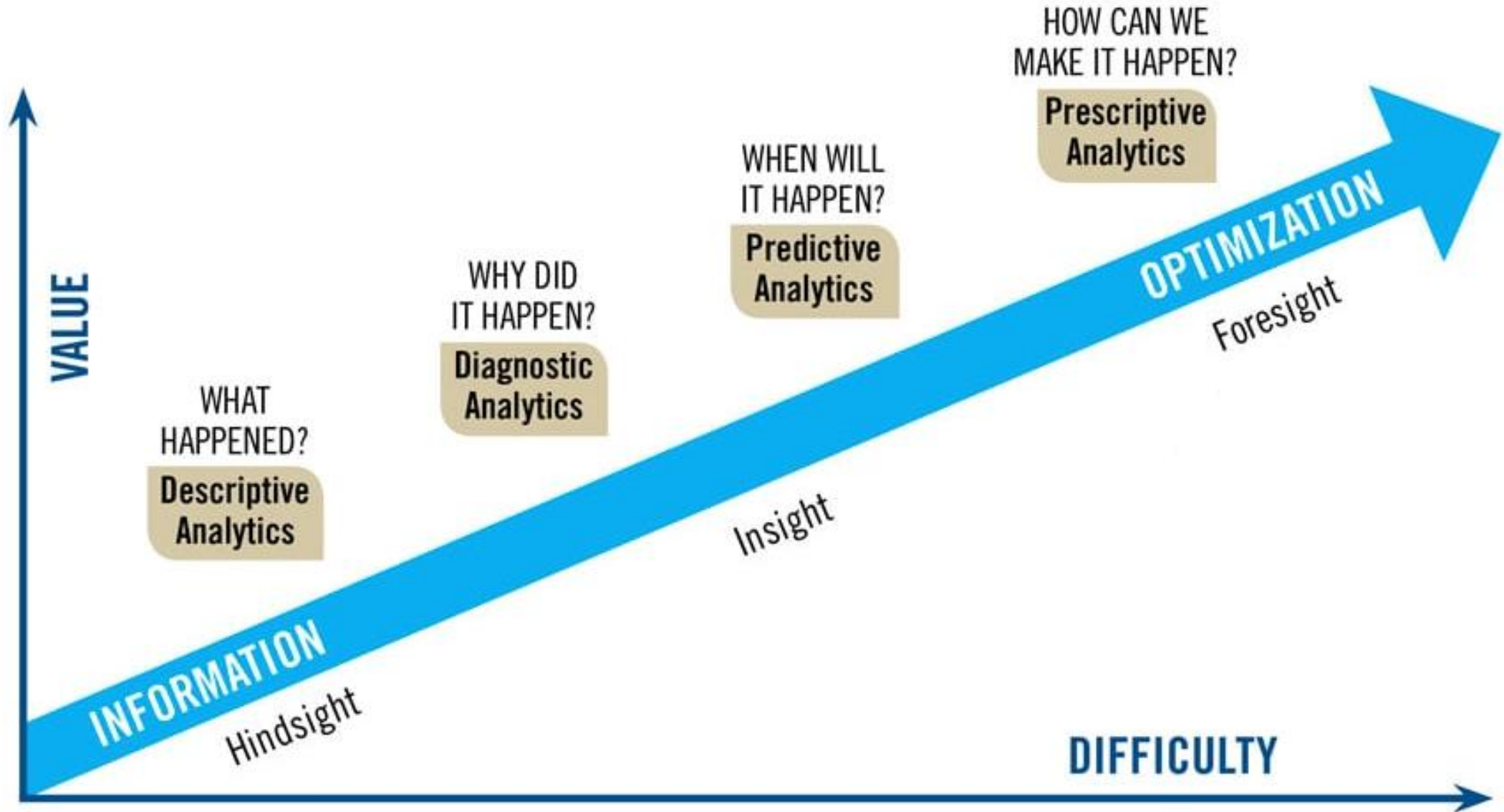

History

- RDP was developed to meet the unique needs of RCOs and other recovery support providers
- Designed to enhance therapeutic alliance
- Aggregation/segregation of data on recovery outcomes
- 2.0 version was developed and launched with feedback from existing customers



RDP Features

- **Meaningful data across levels of participation**

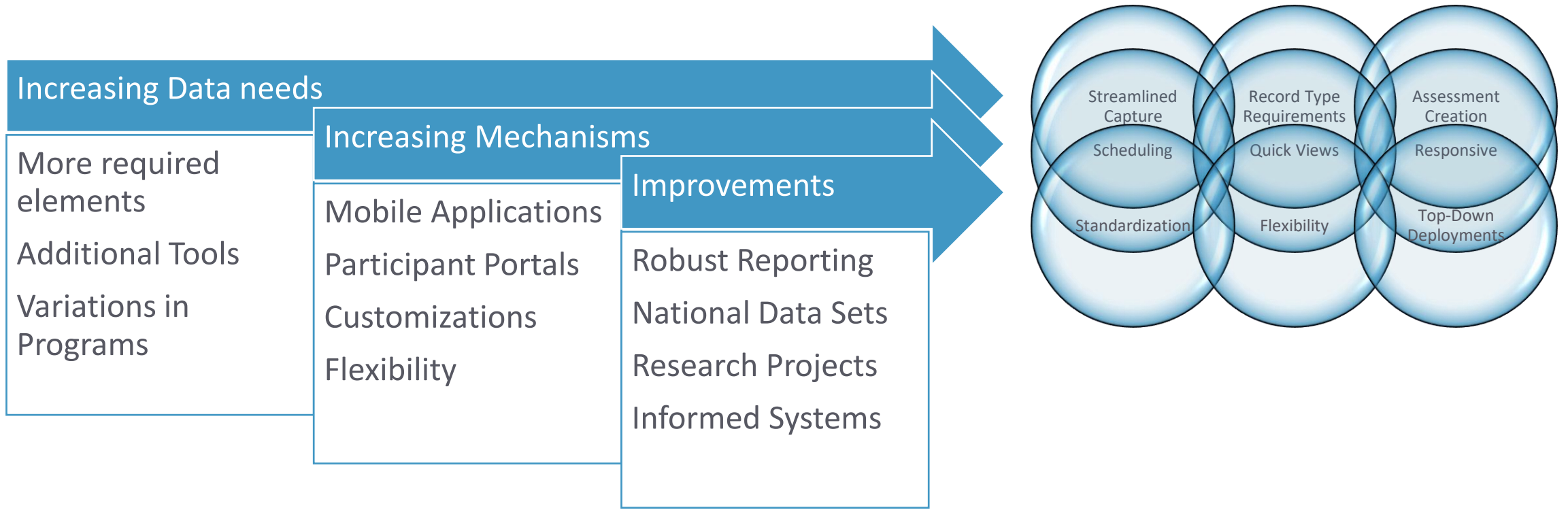

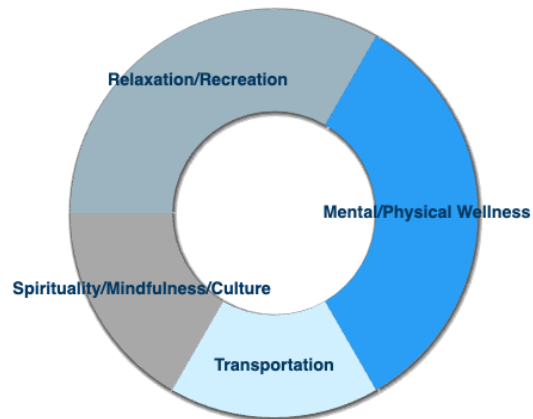

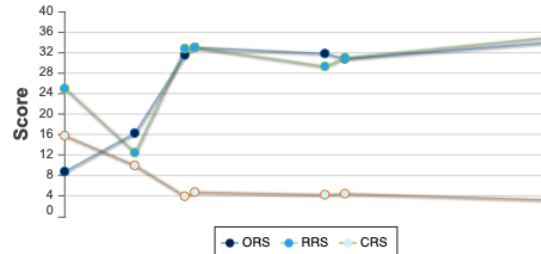

Engagement Scale Data



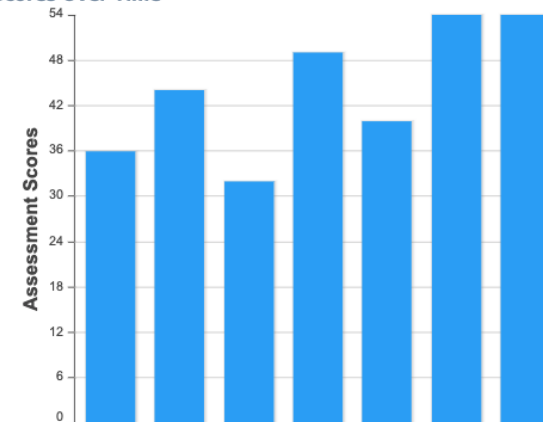
